### Cementon Rebirth Plan Gets \$400K Boost



Greene County's Cementon Rebirth Plan has received a significant boost with \$400,000 in state funding to launch early planning and development studies. The grant, awarded through New York State's FAST NY program, will support the county's efforts to study and revitalize the Cementon area. The Greene County Legislature unanimously approved the project earlier this year, setting the stage for the grant application and study process. Local officials say funding is a key first step toward transforming Cementon into a site ready for new investment and economic growth. FAST NY, the state program backing the initiative, recently awarded more than \$51 million to projects in five counties, including Greene. To date, the program has invested over \$283 million in 34 shovel-ready sites across New York, with another \$100 million secured in the FY 2026 budget for future expansion. greenecountyedc.com/news/cementonrebirth-plan-gets-400k-boost
