Tannersville Awarded \$1.2 Million for Critical Dam Improvements

The Village of Tannersville has been awarded \$1.2 million in state funding for improvements to the earthen dam for Reservoir No. 3, the Village's primary drinking water supply. Those upgrades are mandated by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and include replacement of the reservoir spillway and enhancement of the dam's earthen embankment, which has slowly deteriorated over 68 years because of severe tropical storms

Real Property Tax Service Unveils New Web Map

The [Greene County GIS Web Map](#) has been updated to include the most recent aerial imagery flown in 2025. This update is part of the

New York Statewide Digital Orthoimagery Program, which has been producing high-quality orthoimagery since 2000 and aims to refresh statewide coverage on a four to five year cycle.

Through this ongoing partnership with New York State, Greene County now offers aerial imagery from 2001, 2004, 2009, 2013, 2016, and 2025, providing more than two decades of historical imagery for public use. Regularly updated aerial imagery supports county operations by improving the accuracy and efficiency of property assessment, community planning, and emergency management efforts, while reducing the need for field inspections.

For planning purposes, this imagery helps identify development trends, land-use changes, and growth patterns over time. For residents and other users, it offers a clear visual record of how properties and communities have evolved.

The public is encouraged to explore both the new and historic imagery through the GIS Web Map by selecting the Basemap Gallery widget located in the upper right-hand corner of the map panel.

Proposed SEQRA Reforms

Certain locally focused projects may benefit from the state's "Let Them Build" proposal, included in Governor Hochul's New York State Fiscal Year 2027 Executive Budget.



The proposal would streamline the environmental review process, including changes to SEQRA and expanded use of Generic Environmental Impact Statements (GEISs), for certain projects on previously disturbed sites.

It would also expand SEQRA exemptions and Type II actions for select categories—such as qualifying housing, certain water and wastewater infrastructure work, parks and trails, childcare facilities, and green infrastructure retrofits. In addition, the proposal would set clearer timelines for SEQRA decisions to improve predictability and reduce delays.
